

meet the artistic directors Andrea Lamaina

Andrea LaMaina received her BFA in Dance Performance and Education from Towson University in Maryland. Mrs. LaMaina is the past President of DMA, Florida Chapter 2. She holds a National Teacher Education Certification as well as a Teacher Certification in Dance/Vocational Arts. She is an active member of Dance Educators of American and Dance Masters of America. She is the President of "The Young Dancer Foundation of South Florida, Inc." a non-profit 501(c) (3) organization that accepts charitable, tax deductible donations to benefit talented young dancers. Andrea is the Founder of the So Flo Tap Festival, and produces an annual event to promote the american art form of tap dancing, tap jamming and prestigious summer intensives and higher education dance degree programs. Her eager dancers. Before college, Andrea trained under master teacher Fred Knecht. Andrea has choreographed for the Wellington High School Dance Team from Wellington, Florida, who was invited to perform at the Orange Bowl Classic's half time show. Before becoming co-owner and Artistic Director of That's Dancing, she created an exploratory arts curriculum, which included dance and creative movement. In 1997, she was nominated for The Sallie Mae Best New Teacher of the Year Award, a national honor recognizing her achievements in innovative curriculum development and design for public education. Andrea has also danced professionally with DDM Company based in Fairlawn, New Jersey. She is an active member of the National Dance Association and the Florida Dance Association. In 1994, she was chosen to perform with renowned choreographer Maureen Flemming in an original work at the Stephen's Hall Theater in Baltimore. In 1990,

Andrea was a scholarship recipient for the Alvin Ailey Summer Dance Program. For several years, Andrea was a performer and featured dancer in various roles at

the Bucks County Playhouse in Pennsylvania.

meet the artistic directors Michele Walsh

Michele Walsh holds a Master of Education in Dance from Temple University and a Bachelor of Arts in Theater from the University of Miami. She is the past Vice-President of Dance Masters of America Florida Chapter 2. She is a certified teacher with the Dance Masters of America Organization. She belongs to Dance Educators of America, Florida Chapter. Michele is the teacher and choreographer of Petite Miss Dance of Florida, 2012. She has trained with many respectable dance Purnell School in Pottersville, New Jersey, where she was the Head of the Performing Arts Department and dance teacher. At Purnell, she taught ballet, choreography to students ages 13-18. Michele has choreographed several musicals. including Quilters, The Utter Glory of Morrissey Hall, Prom Queens Unchained, Her work was nominated for Best Ensemble from the Papermill Playhouse Rising danced professionally with the Red Bank Ballet Company and the American Stadium, where she was a featured dancer. To stay on the cutting edge of dance, she has attended the Jazz Dance World Congress in Chicago; the Dance Teacher Now Convention in NYC; the Bates Dance Festival in Lewiston, Maine; the Florida York on the Road, a traveling dance workshop. Michele is also an active member of both the National Dance Association and The Florida Dance Association which promote dance in a variety of venues.

Nicole Smith graduated from the University of Central Florida with a Bachelor of the Arts degree in Interdisciplinary Studies and a minor in dance. She is a That's Dancing and Fusion Force Dance Company Alumni and also trained at New World School of the Arts, a dance conservatory and performing arts college, in Miami. Shortly after completing her first year at NWSA, she was accepted into the University of Central Florida, While attending UCF, Nicole focused her degree studies in dance and the arts. In addition to her active role in the UCF dance community. Nicole also became involved in the performing arts throughout Central Florida and began her career as a dance educator and choreographer. While in college, Nicole was selected to tour with MAC Cosmetics as a model and a tap dancer to help launch their cosmetic line "Hey Sailor!" She has been a part of the Entertainment Department at SeaWorld in Orlando, Florida as a character performer. After a successful season at SeaWorld, Nicole accepted a contract with VEE Corporation to travel and tour the United States and Canada with Sesame Street Live where she was chosen to play the lead role of Elmo in the production: Elmo Makes Music. After her tour ended Nicole moved to South Florida where she continues to teach, perform, and choreograph. Nicole is celebrating her 9th season as a faculty member and resident choreographer at That's Dancing where she also serves as the Director of the Young Dancer Program, overseeing classes for dancers ages 3-6 years old. In addition to teaching, Nicole helps to co-produce So Flo Tap Fest with Andrea LaMaina. This past October, Nicole and Andrea had the opportunity to partner with SoDanca to produce the first ever So Flo Tap Fest and "Toe,Ball. Heal" fundraising event to raise money for the Susan G. Komen Foundation. She is a member of the iTap Online Virtual Dance Community and successfully completed the Tap Teacher Training course this past summer where she focused on teaching tap dance history, improvisation and music theory. Nicole is also certified as a Level 1 "Building Blocks of Dance" instructor which focuses on strength training and injury prevention for young dancers. Her additional credits include: choreography and production work on the short dance film 'Ayita's Dream,' which won Best Film at Film Gate film festival, and lead choreographer for the concept dance video "Presidente," which was used as a strives to inspire and educate the next generation of young artists and leaders.



Christi Cianciotto was born and raised in Boynton Beach Florida. She trained at That's Dancing in Ballet, Tap, Jazz, Lyrical, and Hip Hop until 2015 and was a member of Fusion Force Dance Company from 2009-2015. She was also a part of the Park Vista Community High School Dance Team from 2011-2015. Christi attended Florida Atlantic University and graduated in 2019 with her Bachelors in Communication Studies with a minor in Film and Video.

During her college experience she was a dedicated member of the Florida Atlantic University Dance Team. The FAU Dance Team entertained and energized crowds at designated FAU athletic events, all football, and women and men's basketball games, and promotional events at the direction of the administration of the FAU Department of Athletics. Christi is now a member of the Florida Panthers Dance Team-joining the team in its inaugural year of 2022. Her favorite part about being a professional dancer for the NHL is seeing all her dance students at the games and inspiring them to dream big!. She is currently a Youth Protection Advocates in Dance certified dance instructor. Being trained in ballet, tap, jazz, contemporary, and hip-hop, Christi is now dedicated to teaching and spreading her passion and love for the art of dance to all her students.

A native of Lake Worth, Florida, Clarissa Castañeda began dancing on and off at the age of five but did not start ballet until the age of 13 at Boca Ballet Theater under the direction of Dan Guin and Jane Tyree. While at Boca Ballet Theater, she performed many roles and ballets such as Lilac Fairy in The Sleeping Beauty, The Sacrifice in Dan Guin's The Rite of Spring, George Balanchine's Serenade, George Balanchine's Valse Fantisie, and Arabian Lead in The Nutcracker. After graduating in 2015, she went on to attend The Juilliard School. While at The Juilliard School, Castañeda has performed new works by Helen Simoneau, Katarzyna Skarpetowska, Roy Assaf, Stefanie Batten Bland, and Madison Hicks. She has also performed repertoire such as Crystal Pite's Grace Engine, Richard Alston's Sheer Bravado, Alejandro Cerrudo's Little mortal jump, and Peter Chu's Smile Masking (solo excerpt). Castañeda has also furthered her training at summer programs such as Alonzo King LINES Ballet (full merit scholarship) and Springboard Danse Montréal where she performed William Forsythe's WorkWithinWork (duet excerpt) and a new work by Jasmine Ellis. After receiving her BFA in Dance from The Juilliard School in 2019, Castañeda moved back home to establish herself as a teacher and choreographer in the South Florida region.

Fusion Force Dance Company and her choreography has received numerous awards at regional competitions. Ms. Foster is the teacher and choreographer of Senior Miss Headliner National 2006-2007. Her award winning solo choreography represented Team USA at the IDO World Showdance Championships 2006 in Riesa, Germany and placed 4th in the world. Before joining the That's Dancing family, she served as Dance Director of LimeLight Productions, Inc. in Sierra Vista, Arizona, teaching ballet, jazz, and tap, modern, hip-hop and musical theater. She regularly attends dance workshops and festivals including the Arizona Jazz Dance Festival in Tucson, the Florida Dance Festival in Miami, the Southeastern Tap Explosion in Atlanta and the Jazz Dance World Congress in Chicago. Loren is certified by the state of Florida in Dance K-12 and Elementary Education K-6 and is currently teaching Dance and Project Based Learning at The Conservatory School at North Palm Beach where she collaborates with classroom teachers to design and implement arts integrated projects which inspire students to learn through the arts.

Through his expansive movement vocabulary in a multitude of dance genres — including hip-hop, house, various ballet techniques, Horton technique, Taylor technique, Dunham technique, percussive dance, contemporary, countertechnique, and improvisation — the idea of hybridity within dance is a significant aspect of his movement study and research. Brenan is a two-time YoungArts awardee, that of which includes a 2020 honorable mention and a 2021 merit award in the modern/contemporary discipline. During the 2019-2020 dance season,

Brenan trained as an assistant with Intrigue Dance Convention on their National Competition Tour, that of which sparked his interest and passion for choreography, creation, and dance education.
